Renewal Statement Distribution

Renewal Statements are rolling out to ARTA Benefit Plan members throughout the month. Each ARTA member will receive a mailed copy of their renewal statement by the end of September 2022, or they can be viewed through

MyARTA.net when they become available.

- Members on Comprehensive Plans can view their statement beginning September 1.
- Education Sector members with Total Health, Ultimate Health, or ARTARx+Travel can view their statement beginning September 8.
- Members with Health Wise, Health Wise Plus, ARTARx, and Dental Only can expect their statement by September 15.
- Public and Private Sector members on Total Health, Ultimate Health, or ARTARx+Travel can expect their statement by September 22.

These renewal statements contain changes to the ARTA Benefit Plan which take effect November 1, 2022, including premium updates and plan enhancements. Please take time to review your Renewal Statement when it becomes available. 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ARTA Emergency Travel Insurance — Travel Advisory Exclusion

Normally, ARTA's Emergency Travel Insurance covers members for a period of 92 days (with the option to extend) in the event of sudden and unforeseen medical expenses. However, this coverage is limited in countries and regions that have an active level 3 (Avoid non-essential travel) or level 4 (avoid all travel) advisory in place from the Government of Canada, with the limitations determined by the type of travel advisory.

Travel advisories can be related to civil unrest, war, public health concerns, and more. For example: Ukraine, Belarus, and Russia all have a level 4 advisory status (avoid all travel) due to the current military conflict. So, if you suffered a broken leg in Ukraine unrelated to the war, you would be covered, however, if you were injured by an act of war, you would not be covered.

As of February 2022, advisories related to COVID-19 do not affect Emergency Travel Insurance for ARTA members, though trip cancellation or interruption due to COVID-19 after you depart on your trip remains excluded from coverage.

If a travel advisory is put in place after you have departed for your trip, your coverage remains in place, ARTA members are no longer required to return home within 10 days of the advisory taking effect.
